## FOHS 2018/19

As the new academic year has begun I want to keep you updated on the plans for FOHS this year. As this is a new year all posts are dissolved until the AGM which will be held on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> October at 3.05pm. In order to simplify the decision making process, all current committee members will be deemed to resign immediately prior to the AGM on Friday 19th October. At this point, anyone wishing to stand for election to one of the below positions can be nominated. Should more than one individual wish to stand, a vote will be cast on the day. The positions will be:

- · Chair to chair the meetings, take overall responsibility for the work of FOHS and be a point of contact for non-committee members (all parents, teachers etc)
- · Vice Chair to deputise for the chair, to support the organisation of the work of FOHS and to be a point of contact for non-committee members
- · Treasurer to take responsibility for FOHS finances, collect and bank money and liaise with school
- Secretary to take minutes and notes and distribute to all, take responsibility for social media, coordinate the setting of dates for meetings and events, as well as liaise with school and non-committee members

The proposal will be to hold alternate general FOHS (all welcome) meetings and committee (only) meetings in each month throughout the year. We would be grateful if anyone who can volunteer for these posts for the coming year can email me beforehand to expedite the meeting. If you would like more information about what these roles will entail or the time commitment then also please contact me. All volunteers for the posts should contact me by Monday 15<sup>th</sup> October. If we have more than one volunteer for each post, a vote will be held at the AGM. The AGM will then be followed by a general meeting to discuss plans for the events over the year. Everyone is welcome to attend both the AGM and the following meeting. We will also have a crèche in class one. Under the FOHS constitution, a quorum of members must be at the AGM in order for it to take place - this means a minimum of 10 non-committee members need to attend so please consider coming along.

As we have a number of autumn events to organise soon, we are also having a general FOHS meeting on 28<sup>th</sup> September at 3.05pm— everyone welcome with a crèche in class one. In light of Phil's resignation at the end of last school year, I will chair any meetings until the new committee members are in place.
