As many of you will be aware, last year the parents of FOHS were fundraising to provide an outdoor gazebo for the playground area. Last year £5000 was raised for this project. After much discussion about the most suitable building as well as the parents of FOHS meeting with a group of children in school last week, the members of FOHS would like to be able to provide a sturdier glass fronted building for the children and community to use. Therefore they have decided to fund raise for this over the coming year too. Altogether it will take around £9000 to fund the proposed structure so we do hope parents will be able to help by supporting the events over the year.
