SWAINE MEADOW

Can we please remind parents that Swaine Meadow (the new development on Cross Lane behind the school) does not have wide pavements and occasionally has work taking place that obstructs the pavements. People who live in Swaine Meadow, including children that attend the school, will often walk down the road in order to get to the pavement on Cross Lane. This puts them at risk from cars which are turning into Swaine Meadow. We would ask that parents who drive their children to school should be aware of this potential hazard and, if possible, avoid using Swaine Meadow to turn their car around. Thank you
